


# Instructions for Navigating the Dashboard Game

On the main screen, click play to launch the next screen.




After reading the scenario click the start button to begin.




## Game Play

### Instructions


To close the open instructions, press the 'X' in the right-hand corner. To reopen the instructions, click the "I" icon in the right-hand corner.



Click items listed on the clipboard. Correct items will be circled. After selecting all the items listed, click next level.




After finding the items on all 4 levels, click the done button.



## Quiz Page


Click the start button to begin the quiz.

#### **South Carolina Emergency Management Division (SCEMD)**

*The South Carolina Emergency Management Division (SCEMD) is the agency responsible for emergency management in South Carolina. SCEMD develops, coordinates, and leads the state emergency management program. Visit their website for important information such as closings & delays, emergency shelters and how to make a plan for emergencies.*

#### **Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA)**

*The Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) is a federal agency responsible for ensuring America is equipped to prepare for, respond to, and recover from disasters. There are 10 FEMA regions throughout the United States and the territories. South Carolina is in FEMA region 4 for the Southeast.*

#### **Ready.gov**

*Ready.gov is an official website of the United States Department of Homeland Security. Ready was developed as a public service campaign to educate and empower Americans to be ready to prepare, respond and mitigate emergencies and disasters. It provides resources to help promote disaster and emergency preparedness for all different age groups and abilities. Their resources are available in English and Spanish.*

#### **American Red Cross**

*The American Red Cross is a nonprofit organization with a goal of preventing and relieving suffering. The Red Cross shelters, feeds and provides comfort to people affected by disasters; supplies about 40% of the nation's blood; teaches skills that save lives; distributes international humanitarian aid; and supports veterans, military members and their families.*
