1. Matthew J. Fay – Certified EMT

Investigation, Violation(s), and Enforcement: Department staff received allegations involving Fay and potential and regulatory violations. According to records obtained by the Department, on or about May 19, 2026, Fay was arrested and charged with the following criminal offenses: one count of incest, one count of criminal solicitation of a minor, two counts of accessory before the fact to a felony, one count of conspiracy, four counts of criminal sexual conduct with a minor or attempt in the first degree, and one count of criminal sexual conduct with a minor in the third degree. All of the charged criminal offenses are felonies and crimes involving moral turpitude and gross immorality. On May 26, 2026, and as a result of the seriousness of the allegations, the Department issued an Emergency Suspension Order suspending Fay’s certificate on an emergency basis pending further investigation into the allegations.

None within the last five years.

2. Senior Care OPCO, LLC d/b/a Senior Care of Marion – Licensed Nursing Home

Investigations, Violations, and Enforcement: Department staff conducted complaint investigations on February 1, 2024, and November 12, 2025. As a result of these visits, Department staff cited the Facility for violating Regulation 60-17 by:

- Failing to properly discharge a resident to a location that is appropriate to the resident’s needs and abilities; and
- Failing to keep residents free from mental abuse.

The Department notified the Facility by certified mail it was considering enforcement. On March 26, 2026, the parties met for an enforcement conference. The Department and Facility decided to resolve the matter through a Consent Order, which was executed on May 18, 2026. Pursuant to the Consent Order, the Facility agreed to a \$2,300 monetary penalty for its violations of Regulation 60-17.

3. Greer Post Acute, LLC d/b/a Brushy Creek Post Acute – Licensed Nursing Home

Inspection/Investigation, Violations, and Enforcement: Department staff conducted a routine inspection on October 8, 2025, and a complaint investigation on December 18, 2025. As a result of these visits, Department staff cited the Facility for violating Regulation 60-17 by:

- Failing to administer medications as prescribed by a physician; and
- Failing to provide care, treatment, and services as ordered by a physician.

The Department notified the Facility by certified mail it was considering enforcement. On March 27, 2026, the parties met for an enforcement conference. The Department and Facility decided to resolve the matter through a Consent Order, which was executed on May 15, 2026. Pursuant to the Consent Order, the Facility agreed to an \$8,000 monetary penalty for its violations of Regulation 60-17.
