


#### ANNUAL WIC BREASTFEEDING RATES




Average breastfeeding rates increased  $\frac{2.6}{0.8}$  percentage points (2022 vs. 2021),  $\frac{4.9}{0.8}$  percentage points (2024 vs. 2023).

Note: The federal fiscal year begins in October and ends in September. Federal fiscal year 2024 includes months October through August 2024.



In FFY 2023, 10.6% versus 17.2% of infants participating in the program were fully or partially breastfed, respectively. Comparatively, these rates increased to 11.1% among fully breastfed infants and 18.2% among partially breastfed infants in FFY 2024.



The majority (62.8%) of all breastfed infants in the SC WIC Program were partially breastfed in FFY 2023 compared to 37.2% who were fully breastfed. Although partial breastfed infants continue to make up the majority of breastfed infants in the program, the proportion of infants who are fully breastfed increased 0.6 percentage points to 37.8% of all breastfed infants in the program in FFY 2024.


#### WIC BREASTFEEDING RATES, BY SELECT CHARACTERISTICS

The Native Islander population experienced an 9.5 percentage point increase in their breastfeeding rates from FFY 2023 to FFY 2024.

## South Carolina had the 6th highest breastfeeding rate

among other states in the southeastern region of the United States with Florida having the highest rate (41.3%) and Alabama having the lowest rate (11.4%). Since FFY 2022, breastfeeding rates in South Carolina have increased substantially which may also be consistent with other states across the southeastern region.
